Glenwood's tax base. We have an Urban Revitalization and Urban Renewal Program that was created to attract new businesses as
well as assist existing businesses. These programs along with the new Highway 34 corridor give our community great opportunities
to grow and be attractive to new businesses. My third priority is developing an ordinance to maintain Glenwood's integrity through
creating a standard for rental properties. This would assure that rental properties did not become substandard and hinder its

	to review its contents. I was against the vine street project and the special assessment for the property owners on that street. I was
	able to work with two other council members to join me, we worked out a plan with our financial advisory specialist. We passed the
	project with no special assessment for those property owners. I also demanded higher levels of accountability from our City
	Administrator, I researched Iowa Code and found a written law where financial information was to be submitted to Council by a certain
	date. This was adopted as practice and this has helped our city with solving its financial deficiencies.
